I am writing, as your constituent, to raise the issue of financial education in the UK.

With the cost-of-living crisis impacting families in this constituency and across the UK, it has never been more important for young people to be learning the financial skills they need to flourish in the real world.

Unfortunately, financial education is not taught in the vast majority of primary schools, which, according to this [Cambridge University study](#), is the time when most children's money habits are set. Teaching at secondary school level is currently ad-hoc and usually sandwiched into maths or citizenship lessons.

I believe that all young children should have access to dedicated financial education lessons that will teach them how to manage their money, budget, and confidently handle financial products and services they will encounter as they grow up.

That is why I have signed [the petition](#) tabled by GoHenry calling for the Government to make financial education compulsory from primary school level for all children.

I agree with GoHenry's research which shows the positive impact that financial education can have on young people.
